### Before the Meeting Preparation:

Create a Parent's Newsletter to let them know what the girls will be working on during the first six meetings. Ask for their assistance in helping the girls learn the Girl Scout Promise and inform them about the Investiture Ceremony taking place during the sixth meeting. **It is suggested that you send out a newsletter at least every other month to keep families informed of major activities throughout the year.**

### Goals I and III: Developing Self-Potential and Developing Values

#### Supplies and Equipment

---

#### Pre-Meeting Activity - approximately 10 minutes

Arrange materials on tables. As girls arrive, they draw pictures of things they would like to do during their Girl Scout meetings.

Divided paper, crayons or fine markers

---

#### Opening Activity - approximately 15 minutes

Use the Quiet Sign to gain girls attention and ask them to join you in a circle. Show them the Girl Scout sign (three fingers) and have them practice. Read or say the full Girl Scout Promise. Have girls repeat each line after you. Use graphics from the Daisy Girl Scout *Promise Path Game*. Explain to the girls that each week, they will be learning parts of the Promise by playing a special game designed just for them!

#### Daisy Circle (Business & Snack) - 10 minutes

Review kaper chart and the buddy system. Have girls who brought treats pass them out. Visit informally with the girls while they eat their treats and get to know individual girls better. As time permits, share girls' pictures from the pre-meeting activity. Display if possible.

#### Main Activity - approximately 20 minutes

"The First Daisy" - who was Juliette Gordon Low? Share "Fun Daisy Tales" on p. 25 in *The Guide for Daisy Girl Scout Leaders*. Allow the girls time to share their own stories. Have girls complete "The First Daisy" activity on pp. 16-17 in the *Daisy Girl Scout Activity Book*.

#### Clean-Up - approximately 10 minutes

Sweep floor and pick up supplies from pre-meeting activity.

#### Closing Activity - approximately 5 minutes

Have girls gather their belongings, put on their coats and form a circle. Holding hands, play "I like \_\_\_\_\_" (the name of the girl) because she "\_\_\_\_\_ " around the circle. When a girl's name is mentioned she puts her foot in the circle and says something nice about someone else in the circle. Continue until everyone has a foot in the circle, and then say, "Good-bye Daisy Girl Scouts!" Send Parent Newsletter home with girls along with Treat Bucket.
