Meeting Location _____

Before the Meeting Preparation:

Collect supplies, dishes, paper cups and equipment for celebration snack and ceremony. Don't forget cutting boards!

Review the Investiture Ceremony, pp. 27-28, *Ceremonies in Girl Scouting*. Adjust the ceremony (p. 28) using 10 Learning Petals to represent each part of the law and one circle to represent the Promise Center (pp. 20-21 in *The Guide for Daisy Girl Scout Leaders*. Glue photograph to the appropriately colored petal for each part of the Law. Refer to page 21 in the *Guide for Daisy Girl Scout Leaders* for petal colors. A candlelighting ceremony could be included by having leaders light the candles (or flashlights) while girls say the Promise and asking parents to read the Law while a girl holds up an appropriate "photograph petal" demonstrating that part of the Law.

Trace a second set of Me-shirt blanks for girls and their guests.

Create a special kaper chart giving jobs to girls and family members for the setup of the ceremony and refreshments. Jobs can include: food preparation; setting up the horseshoe; the presentation table and candle ceremony; and clean-up.

Goals II and III: Relating to Others and Developing Values

Supplies and Equipment

Pre-Meeting Activity - approximately 10 minutes

Girls work with their guests to complete a me-shirt of activities they like to do together. If possible, place tables against the wall, leaving center of room open.

Me-shirt blanks, crayons, colored pencils or fine-line markers.

Opening Activity - approximately 10 minutes

Hold up the Quiet Sign and ask girls and their guests to join you in the circle. Girls introduce their guests giving their names, relationships and showing one thing on the me-shirt of something they do together.

Daisy Circle (Business & Snack) - 15 minutes

Have food set out so girls and their families can assist in its preparation. Discuss hand washing before food preparation and the safety circle (a safety circle is the distance that cannot be entered surrounding a person with a sharp object. The distance is measured by the person standing with outstretched arms holding the sharp object and slowly turning in a circle). Show kaper chart and review tasks.

Main Activity - approximately 20 minutes

When everything looks ready, hold hands with one Daisy Girl Scout and form a Daisy Chain singing *Make New Friends*. Conduct Investiture Ceremony: lead line into a horseshoe facing the presentation table. Briefly explain what the girls and their guest will be doing during the ceremony while handing out any reference cards and photographs. Explain the purpose of the Promise Center and where to place it on the tunic to guests. Distribute one per girl.

Girls having treat bucket this meeting are the hostesses and should invite people to have refreshments. Play one of the games learned during previous meetings.

Daisy Girl Scout pins and Promise Center—I for each girl
Index cards with 10 parts of the Girl Scout Law
Candles, matches or flashlights
Photographs (optional)

Clean-Up - approximately 10 minutes

Clean up refreshment table. Girls and guests should have already taken care of individual clean-up. Pack up supplies used for Investiture and pre-meeting activities. Girls assist leaders with resetting the room. Sweep floor and tidy up as necessary.

Kaper Chart

Closing Activity - approximately 5 minutes

Join together in a circle holding hands. Thank family members for joining the troop today. Invite everyone in the circle to think of a wish. Pass the friendship squeeze around the circle. As the squeeze reaches each person, they make their special wish silently and pass the squeeze on to the next person. Say "Welcome to Daisy Girl Scouting, see you at the next meeting" and send the girls on their way home. Send Treat Bucket home.
