## **Before the Meeting Preparation:**

Print the Girl Scout Law on ten large index cards, one segment of the Law to each card.

Design an "Interview Scramble" sheet (see below) - create 5-6 questions for the activity (favorite color, favorite hobby, etc.) Use your knowledge of the girls to develop the questions.

Purchase three disposable cameras or ask volunteers to bring cameras to this meeting. Minimum of 12 exposures per camera are needed for the activity.

Create a Kaper Chart for this meeting and a blank form for the patrols to fill in for the next four meetings.

Order membership pins for the Investiture/Rededication Ceremony.

## **Goal: Developing Individual Potential**

### **Supplies and Equipment**

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#### **Pre-Meeting Activity - approximately 5 minutes**

Interview Scramble—girls pair off as they arrive and conduct interview using the following directions: "Interview your partner and fill out the sheet for her. Do not write your names on the sheets. Turn the completed sheet in to your leader".

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#### **Opening Activity - approximately 10 minutes**

Give one card of the Girl Scout Law to each of 10 girls. Form a horseshoe and conduct the flag ceremony. Recite the Girl Scout Promise. Ask girls to read from their index card in order each part of the girl Scout Law. Invite girls to share two-three examples of how they live by that part of the Law.

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#### **Business & Snack - approximately 30 minutes**

Take attendance in patrols and collect dues. Explain the Investiture/Rededication Ceremony. Determine, date, time, location and logistics (will there be refreshments; will there be guests; does this require an invitation; will there be entertainment - if so what form of entertainment; what should be included in the ceremony?). Divide up the tasks among the patrols.

Dues collection sheet for each patrol leader (Refer to: *Welcome to Girl Scouting* packet)

Introduce a Kaper Chart to patrols with sections filled in for activities already planned (review meeting plans). Inform the girls that their small groups from the last meeting will be their patrols until after the Investiture/Rededication ceremony. Girls name their patrol, select a patrol leader and finish filling in the Kaper Chart for the next four meetings.

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#### **Main Activity - approximately 55 minutes**

Interview Scramble - finish activity begun during the pre-meeting time. Post the sheets on the wall or tables. Girls circulate and try to match the sheet to each girl in the troop. They write their guess down on the sheet. After all the guesses have been made, girls tally the number of guesses on their own sheets which were correct. Discuss whether girls were surprised with the results.

The Girl Scout Law - give a camera to each patrol along with three parts of the Law. Give directions that girls are to state a picture which demonstrates how girls live by that part of the Law.

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#### **Clean-Up - approximately 5 minutes**

Collect cameras from girls. Each patrol returns props to where they were found. Other tasks accomplished in accordance to the Kaper Chart.

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#### **Closing Activity - approximately 5 minutes**

Join together in a Friendship Circle. Explain to the girls that next week they will be going outside and to bring appropriate clothing. Invite girls to share one new thing they learned about someone today. *Sing Make New Friends* in celebration of the deepening friendships. Say "Goody Bye Girl Scouts" and twist out of the Friendship Circle.
