## **Before the Meeting Preparation:**

Create a voting board for the Troop Crest. Have space on the board for girls to write down why they are selecting this particular crest for the troop. Girls can vote anytime during the meeting when there is free time. Only one vote may be cast per girl.

Find a white sheet and high intensity lamp to be used during main activity. Review parts of the Law which have not yet been covered and which require reinforcement.

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## **Goal: Developing Individual Potential & Relating to Others**

### Supplies and Equipment

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#### **Pre-Meeting Activity - approximately 15 minutes**

Post the Voting Board in an unobstructed area with directions for voting. Girls responsible for Opening session and other parts of the meeting should meet briefly to make sure they are ready to proceed. Same for the girls responsible for next week's meeting.

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#### **Opening Activity - approximately 5 minutes**

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#### **Business & Snack - approximately 35 minutes**

Remind girls that they must vote on a Troop Crest before the end of the meeting. Announce when the Investiture/Rededication ceremony will take place (two meetings from now). Give an assignment (determined during last meeting) to each patrol with appropriate resources. Girls have the next 25 minutes to plan and begin preparations for the celebration. Collect dues, take attendance and have snack during this time.

*Ceremonies in Girl Scouting*, a party cook book and references in their handbook to recipes, paper, glue, markers and other supplies for making invitations if needed.

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#### **Main Activity - approximately 30 minutes**

In partners or groups of three, girls must create a shadow play of a selected part of the Girl Scout Law. To do this, write each different part of the Law on a slip of paper. Girls select a slip of paper and have 10 minutes to prepare. Girls then present their shadow play demonstrating that part of the Law. Discuss whether this would be a way to share the Girl Scout Law with their guests (if they are having guests) during the Investiture/Rededication celebration. What are some other things that they would like to share with their guests during the ceremony?

White sheet and high intensity lamp. Secure the white sheet so girls can stand behind it. Shine the light from behind sheet and darken room.
